

Ringgold County Board of Supervisors Minutes

April 10, 2023

The Ringgold County Board of Supervisors met in regular session Monday, April 10, 2023. The meeting was called to order at 9:00 A.M with the following members present: Colby Holmes, Steve Knapp and Randy Taylor.

A motion was made by Knapp, second by Taylor to approve the agenda.
AYES: Unanimous NAYS: None

Engineer Jared Johnson met with the Board to provide secondary roads updates. The crew worked to hoist frame for the upcoming construction season.

Spot rock was hauled to the South Central and Southwest maintainer districts.

Blades were out working to repair potholes, corrugations, and move rock out of the windrow into the road.

Removed concrete given to the County was broken into revetment sized pieces and stockpiled for later use.

Work order update:

WO 1064: Clear brush/trees and re-shape ditch and backslopes for approximately 2700'. Located along P68 between 260th and 270th Street. (In Progress).

A design profile for the J55 project has been submitted to the department for review. Projected yields for the east portion is 112% and 121% for the west.

Last week at the Grant 13 site the contractor placed reinforcing steel, formed, and poured the south apron and outlet barrel section floor, north interior barrel section floor, south headwall and barrel section walls and slab. This week, weather pending, the contracting is planning to place reinforcing steel, form, and pour the north curtain wall, south interior barrel section walls and slab, and north apron and inlet barrel section floor.

The contractor is currently anticipating beginning the Benton 11 project sometime in May. Petticord was on site last week to mulch the previously cleared trees and brush. Knapp reported to Johnson a complaint he received regarding rock pushed off in the ditch following road maintenance. He fully understands this can happen when blading snow, some rock can be pushed in the ditch, but with proper blading technique, the rock should be worked back and forth across the road through the month. Johnson said he would address this.

Johnson explained to the Board with the statewide extension of county budget certifications from March 31 to April 30 as a result of Senate File 181, there was no extension granted for submission to the DOT. Therefore, approval, subject to the outcome of the FY24 budget hearing on April 24th, needs to be considered today for the secondary roads budget only in order to meet the standing deadline of April 15 for DOT. The Board moved forward with approval.

The Board moved forward with approval of claims paid Wednesday, April 5.

THEREFORE, a motion was made by Knapp and seconded by Taylor stating such.

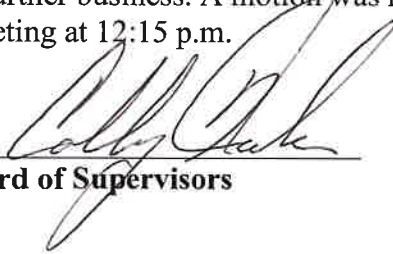
The vote on the resolution: AYES: Unanimous. NAYS: None.
